- *Must attend a Public, Public Charter or Homeschool in one of the select recruiting cities; and*
- *Students with disabilities are encouraged to apply*

Key Components to World Learning Youth Programs: 3-4 weeks long

- **Activities:** Teambuilding, Homestays, School & NGO visits, Travel, Volunteer Work, Project Planning, Dialogue
- **Themes:** Leadership, Global Issues, Peacebuilding, Civic Education, Highly Interactive Experientially Based Learning
- **Skills:** Leadership, Project Planning, Foreign Language, Social Media Skills, Cross-Cultural Communication
